

# GRANITE WAY

WITH FUNDING FROM ROYALTIES FOR REGIONS, THE GRANITE WAY PROJECT IS FINALLY A REALITY, AFTER NEARLY 10 YEARS OF PLANNING AND CONSULTATION.

IT INVOLVES THE CREATION OF A TOURIST DRIVE, TAKING IN KWOLYIN, KOKERBIN ROCK, MT. STIRLING AND CAROLINE GAP. PICNIC INFRASTRUCTURE WILL EITHER BE CREATED OR IMPROVED AT THESE SITES.

ADDITIONALLY, KWOLYIN WILL BE THE HUB OF THE DRIVE, WITH THE CREATION OF A FREE CAMPING AREA, INCORPORATING TOILETS, PICNIC AREAS, CAMP KITCHEN, SHELTERS AND BUSH WALKS. THIS DEVELOPMENT IS MEANT TO REDUCE CAMPING PRESSURE ON KOKERBIN ROCK, WHERE CAMPING WILL BE BANNED.

THE KWOLYIN CAMPING AREA WILL BE BUILT IN A BUSHLAND SETTING, ADJACENT TO COARIN NATURE RESERVE, AND IS DESIGNED TO ACCOMMODATE THE INCREASING NUMBER OF VISITORS TOURING THE REGION.

FREE CAMPING WILL NEVER GET BETTER THAN THIS. BY COUPLING IT TO THE GRANITE WAY DRIVE, WE HOPE TO ATTRACT MORE VISITORS TO THE REGION. THE CAMPING AREA WILL ALSO BE ABLE TO CATER FOR SCHOOL GROUPS, 4WD CLUBS, MOTOR CYCLE CLUBS AND NATURE GROUPS. THE DEVELOPMENT SHOULD BE READY TO USE BY THE END OF SEPTEMBER, 2013.
